Participation in the planning, conduct, and evaluation of the preventive and educational programs of the Pastoral Institute to include: Workshops, clinics, or seminars for clergy persons as well as other professionals; Community and public educational workshops and seminar In-services. Performance of general administrative duties to include: Participates in public relations services of the Institute as needed. Maintenance of appropriate records, reports and other data pertinent to the activities of this position. Complies with confidentiality and HIPAA regulations. Other duties as assigned.
